

Boys & Girls Club in New Jersey receives \$60,000 grant from the Wells Fargo Foundation to prepare youth in career exploration and job readiness

Clifton, NJ, December 18, 2015 — The Boys and Girls Club in New Jersey (BGCNJ) has been awarded a \$60,000 grant from the Wells Fargo Foundation to support the Career Launch program at Boys & Girls Clubs in Clifton, Jersey City, Hoboken, Newark, Paterson, Elizabeth, Plainfield, Garfield, Hawthorne and Lodi. The Career Launch program prepares young people, ages 13 – 18, to enter the work force, advance from "job" to "career" and become self-sufficient adults. The program works with each youth to identify the career that best fits the members' skills and interests. Career Launch includes an interactive website, classroom instruction, guest presentations from professionals in various fields of study, job search assistance, on the job training and internship opportunities.
