

## **EXCEPTIONAL New Jersey TEEN NAMED 'MILITARY YOUTH OF THE YEAR'**

Michael Lewis to Now Vie for Northeast Region Title and Scholarship from Boys & Girls Clubs of America

Clifton, NJ, August 6, 2020 – Michael Lewis has been named the Youth of the Year by Boys & Girls Clubs of America. Youth of the Year title is a prestigious honor bestowed upon an exemplary young person in recognition of leadership, service, academic excellence and dedication to live a healthy lifestyle. Now in its 73<sup>rd</sup> year, the Youth of the Year program honors our nation's most awe-inspiring young people on their path to great futures. Michael will represent all members of Boys & Girls Clubs-affiliated Youth Centers in New Jersey. He will receive a \$6,000 college scholarship -- \$3,500 from Boys & Girls Clubs in New Jersey and \$2,500 from Boys & Girls Clubs of America, Michael will go on to contend for the regional Youth of the Year and ultimately the national title.

Michael has been a member of the McGuire Youth Center for 13 years since he was in first grade. He participated in many Club programs including Money Matters and Passport to Manhood. In addition, Michael held positions for his Club's teen group dedicated to leadership and community service serving as Keystone Club President and Vice President. Other community service activities include his work with World Wide Day of Play, Olympic Day, Month of the Military Child, and weekly activities on the base working with younger youth. Michael has received a number of honors including The National Society of High School Scholars, Kitty Hawk Air Society, JROTC Tusekegee Airmen Award, and the JROTC Celebrate Freedon Foundation Award. Michael recently graduated from North Burlington High School and will be attending University of Alabama Huntsville this Fall, majoring in Astrophysics. His career aspiration is to work at NASA.

As the New Jersey Military Youth of the Year, Michael will serve as a spokesperson for young people across the state who face the many unique challenges associated with military life."
