

## EXCEPTIONAL NEW JERSEY TEEN RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS HONOR, NAMED 'NEW JERSEY MILITARY YOUTH OF THE YEAR'

Victor A. Oluwagbemi Receives \$6,000 College Scholarship From Boys & Girls Clubs In New Jersey And Boys & Girls Clubs Of America – To Vie For Northeast Region Title This June

Clifton, NJ, May 24, 2021 – Victor from Fort Dix Youth Center has been named the New Jersey Military Youth of the Year by Boys & Girls Clubs in New Jersey and Boys & Girls Clubs of America. The Youth of the Year title is a prestigious honor bestowed upon an exemplary young person in recognition of leadership, service, academic excellence, and dedication to live a healthy lifestyle. Now in its 74<sup>th</sup> year, the program honors our nation's most awe-inspiring young people on their path to great futures. As the New Jersey Military Youth of the Year, Victor will serve as an ambassador for teens throughout the state. Victor will receive a \$6,000 college scholarship from Boys & Girls Clubs in New Jersey and Boys & Girls Clubs of America and will go on to contend for the regional Youth of the Year and ultimately the national title.

Victor has been a Club member at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst for 14 years, where he has participated in many Club programs that helped him to become the leader he is today. Presently, he serves in a dual capacity as President and Secretary of the Keystone Club; a teen group dedicated to leadership and community service. From this Club, Victor developed a strong passion for volunteering including food and clothing drives for homeless shelters, nursing homes, hospitals, and Dorm Airmen on base. In 2020, Victor designed masks and T-shirts to create awareness of the effects of Domestic Violence and Teen Violence. Victor is a Mentor for Passport to Manhood and Power Hour Club programs. Victor has maintained a 3.84 GPA while attending Pemberton Township High School (PTHS). He was elected as the PTHS Youth delegate for the American Legion Jersey's Boys State.

Victor is also a Peer Mentor Assistant for Pemberton High School, where he also serves on several teams and clubs. He earned the 2020 Voice of Democracy Merit Certificate Award for being an Outstanding Spokesperson of Freedom. Victor will attend Ramapo College of New Jersey, majoring in Law and Society with a minor in Business. His career aspiration is to be a Corporate Lawyer, so he can "give back" to the community that has been so generous to him.
